BAPTISM OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

I. Holy Spirit

(Greek, pneuma) - denotes the wind, to breathe or blow, breath,

especially like the wind, it's invisible, immaterial, powerful.

- A. The Holy Spirit (<u>breath</u> of <u>God</u>) has been sent to come and <u>live</u> on the inside of us, after we have received our new birth.
 - B. It is a gift and must be received as such.
 - C. When we are born again, we receive a new spirit. We are no longer spiritually dead, now we must <u>receive God's Spirit</u> within us.
- D. The initial <u>evidence</u> of having received the Baptism of the Holy

Spirit is speaking in tongues.

II. A PROMISE

- A. The Promise
 - 1. Isaiah 28:11
 - 2. Joel 2:28
 - 3. Acts 1:4-5

(vs 4) And being assembled together with them,

commanded

them that they should not depart from

Jerusalem, but wait for

the promise of the Father, which, saith He, ye

have heard

of Me.

(vs 5) For John truly baptized with water, but ye

shall be

baptized with the Holy Ghost not many days

hence.

B. Promise is for today.

Acts 2:38b-39 ...and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

For the promise is unto you, and to your children,

and to all

that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God

shall call.

III. PURPOSE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

A. Empowers us

1. Power - (Amplified): ability, efficiency, and might

a. Luke 24:49b ...until ye be endued with power

from on

high.

b. Acts 1:8a But ye shall receive power, after that

the

Holy Ghost is come upon you:...

2. To be witnesses

Acts 1:8b ...and ye shall be witnesses unto Me...

B. Comforter / Teacher

(Amplified) - <u>Counselor</u>, <u>Helper</u>, Intercessor, Advocate, <u>Strengthener</u>, Standby

1. John 14:16-18 (Amplified) ... I will not leave you

orphans--

comfortless, desolate, bereaved, forlorn, helpless...

2. John 14:26b ...He shall <u>teach</u> you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I

have

of

said unto you.

- C. Testifies of Jesus/Magnifies God
 - 1. John 15:26 ...He (Comforter, Holy Ghost) shall testify

Me (Jesus):

2. Acts 2:11 ...we do hear them speak in our tongues the

wonderful works of God.

- 3. Acts 10:46a For they heard them speak with tongues, and <u>magnify</u> God.
- D. Guides/Leads/Convicts

(Amplified) - Counselor, Helper, Intercessor, Advocate, Strengthener, Standby

1. Guides / Leads Us

John 16:7, 13 ...He will <u>guide</u> you into all truth:... Luke 4:1-13 And Jesus being full of the Holy Ghost returned from Jordan, and was <u>led</u> by the Spirit into the wilderness....

- 2. Convicts Us
 - a. of sin
 - b. of righteousness
 - c. of judgment (Acts 26:18)
- E. Helps Us In Prayer/We Speak To God
- 1. Romans 8:26 Likewise the Spirit also <u>helpeth</u> our infirmities:

for we know not what we should pray for as we

ought:

but the Spirit itself (Himself) maketh intercession for

us

with groanings which cannot be uttered

- a. helpeth (Greek) To take hold of together.
- b. infirmities (Greek) Feebleness or weakness of

mind

or body. Lack of knowledge.

c. which cannot be uttered - (Original Greek

manuscript)-

which cannot be articulated with natural

speech.

- 2. I Corinthians 14:2 For he that speaketh in an unknown tongue speaketh not unto men, but unto God:...
- F. Edifies (Builds Up)

(Amplified) - Improves

I Corinthians 14:4a He that speaketh in an unknown

tongue

edifieth himself;...

IV. EVIDENCE OF THE PROMISE FULFILLED

A. <u>Tongues</u>

1. Acts 2:4 And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost,

and

began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit

gave

them utterance.

- 2. Acts 10:45-48
- 3. Acts 19:2, 6 And when Paul had laid his hands upon them,

the Holy Ghost came on them; and they <u>spake</u> <u>with</u> <u>tongues</u> and prophesied.

B. Two Kinds of tongues

I Corinthians 13:1

- 1. <u>Men</u> Language that you are unfamiliar with, but is spoken in the world today.
- 2. <u>Angels</u> Language known only in heaven.

V. Not For The **Unbeliever**

A. The <u>new birth</u> makes room to receive the Baptism of the Holy

Spirit.

1. Luke 5:37... And no man putteth new wine into old bottles;

else the new wine will burst the bottles.

2. John 14:17a ...whom the world cannot <u>receive</u>, because it

seeth Him not, neither knoweth Him:...

VI. A Gift

A. Acts 10:45b ...because that on the Gentiles also was poured out

the gift of the Holy Ghost.

B. I Corinthians 12:1-11 (vs 4) Now there are diversities of gifts, but

the same Spirit.

- 1. The Nine Gifts of the Spirit:
 - a. Word of Wisdom
 - b. Word of Knowledge
 - c. Gift of Faith
 - d. Gifts of Healing
 - e. Working of Miracles
 - f. Gift of Prophecy
 - g. Discerning of Spirits
 - h. Divers Kinds of Tongues
 - i. Interpretation of Tongues
