PRAISE AND WORSHIP

I. DEFINITIONS:

A. PRAISE

Webster - To commend the worth of, express approval or admiration

of, to glorify and exalt God.

Hebrew - Halal (haw-lal') - To make a show; to boast; to

be

clamorously foolish; to rave.

1. Praise in the church:

a. To glorify God (directed to God) with

purpose to

honor God.

b. It is <u>not</u> to be in purpose to make a <u>show</u> of one's self.

B. WORSHIP

Webster - <u>Extreme devotion</u>, <u>intense love</u> or admiration, to idolize.

Greek - Proskuneo (pros-koo-neh'-o) - Like a dog licking his master's

hand, to crouch or fawn to, to prostrate oneself in

homage or

reverence to.

Greek - Latreuo (lat-ryoo'-o) - To render religious homage to, or to

minister to God.

- C. The difference in Praise and Worship is:
 - 1. Praise Him for what He has done and is doing.
 - 2. Worship Him for who He is.

II. WHY WE SHOULD PRAISE GOD:

- A. God <u>dwells</u> in the midst of our praises.
 - a. Psa 22:3, "But thou art holy, O thou that <u>inhabitest</u> the praises of Israel.

III. HOW TO PRAISE AND WORSHIP HIM:

A. In <u>Spirit</u> and in <u>Truth</u>.

John 4:24 God is a Spirit: and they that <u>worship</u> Him <u>must</u> worship Him in <u>spirit</u> and in <u>truth</u>.

B. With my whole heart.

Psa. 9:1a I will praise thee, O Lord, with my whole heart:...

C. With all that is within me.

Psa. 103:1-2 Bless the Lord, O my soul: and <u>all</u> that is <u>within</u> me, <u>bless</u> His holy name. Bless the Lord, O my soul, and <u>forget</u> not all His benefits.

D. Must be from the heart, or it is in vain.

Matt. 15:8-9 This people draweth nigh unto Me with their mouth, and honoureth Me with their lips; but their heart is far from me. (vs 9) But in vain they do worship Me, teaching for doctrines the the

commandments

of men.

1. There is a difference in vain (<u>fake</u>) worship and worshipping in <u>faith</u>.

IV. SACRIFICES OF PRAISE:

- A. When you start out, you will not always feel like praising.
 - 1. Psa. 34:1 I will bless the Lord at <u>all</u> times: His praise

shall

continually be in my mouth.

- 2. Heb. 13:15 By Him therefore let us offer the <u>sacrifice</u> of <u>praise</u> to God continually, that is, the fruit of our lips giving thanks to His name.
- 3. Psa. 42:5 Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted in me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise Him for the help of His countenance.
 - 4. Psa. 103:1-2 Read
 - B. Praising God will <u>lift</u> you up. For one thing, it will get your <u>mind</u> off of <u>yourself</u> and the circumstances.

V. PERFECTED PRAISE:

- A. Perfected praise is <u>pure</u> praise, like from a child that is innocent and untainted from worldly thoughts and ways.
- 1. Matt 21:16b ...Yea; have ye never read, Out of the mouth

 of babes and sucklings thou hast perfected praise?

 2. Psa. 8:2 Read

VI. WAYS AND EXPRESSIONS OF PRAISE AND WORSHIP:

- A. With a <u>loud voice</u> or <u>shout</u>.
- 1. Psa. 35:27a Let them <u>shout</u> for <u>joy</u>, and be glad, that favour my righteous cause: yea, let them <u>say</u> continually, Let the Lord be magnified,...

Praise and Worship

- 2. Psa. 47:1b ...shout unto God with the voice of triumph.
- 3. Luke 19:37b ...the whole multitude of the disciples began to rejoice and praise God with a loud voice for all the mighty works that they had seen.
 - B. With our lips / mouth.
- 1. Psa. 63:3 Because Thy lovingkindness is better than life, my lips shall praise Thee.
 - 2. Psa. 51:15 O Lord, open thou my lips; and my mouth shall shew forth thy praise.
 - C. With musical instruments.
- 1. Psa. 33:2 Praise the Lord with <a href="https://nexum.ncb.nlm.nexum.n
 - 2. Psa. 150:3-5 Read
 - D. With dancing.
 - 1. Psa. 149:3a Let them <u>praise</u> His name in the dance:...
 - 2. Psa. 150:4 Praise Him with the timbrel and dance:...
 - E. With singing.
 - 1. Psa. 9:2 I will be glad and rejoice in thee: <u>I will sing</u> praise to Thy name, O thou most High.
 - 2. Psa. 33:3a Sing unto Him a new song;...
 - 3. Eph. 5:18-20 Read (...singing and making melody in

your

heart to the Lord;)

- F. With uplifted hands.
- 1. Psa. 63:4 Thus will I bless Thee while I live: I will lift up my hands in Thy name.
 - 2. Psa. 141:2 Read
 - 3. I Tim. 2:8 Read
 - G. With clapping hands.
 - 1. Psa. 47:1a O <u>clap</u> your <u>hands</u>, <u>all</u> ye people...
 - H. Praising with the Word.
 - 1. Col. 3:16 Read
 - I. Praising in the Spirit.
 - 1. Eph. 5:19 Read

VII. RESULTS OF PRAISE:

- A. Releases Faith.
 - 1. Psa. 103:1-5 Read
- B. <u>Deliverance</u> comes.
 - 1. Acts 16:25-26 Read
- C. Joy comes.
 - 1. Psa. 71:23 My lips shall greatly rejoice...
- D. Improves <u>Countenance</u>.

- 1. Psa. 33:1 Rejoice in the Lord, O ye righteous: for praise is <u>comely</u> for the <u>upright</u>.
- 2. Psa 147:1 Praise ye the Lord: for it is <u>good</u> to sing praises unto our God; for it is pleasant; and <u>praise</u> is <u>comely</u>.

E. <u>Unity</u> of <u>Spirit</u>.

F. Gives Strength.

 - 1. Psa. 50:23 Whoso <u>offereth praise glorifieth</u> Me: and to him that <u>ordereth</u> his conversation aright will I shew the salvation of God.
