# I. WHAT IS MEANT BY "CHRISTIAN ETHICS"?

- A. Ethics are <u>standards</u> and <u>rules</u> for correct behavior.
- B. How we talk and what we do reveals our ethics.
- C. "Christian Ethics" refers to how we are to conduct ourselves as Christians.
- D. There are times when new Christians are unsure what God expects

  of them in differing circumstances. This must be <u>learned</u> through

Bible study and instruction from mature Christians.

# E. Paul the Apostle said:

"But if I tarry long, that thou mayest know how thou oughtest to <u>behave</u> thyself in the House of God, which is the church of the Living God, the Pillar and Ground of the Truth." (I Tim.3:15)

# II. DOES MAN BY NATURE HAVE THE PROPER CODE OF BEHAVIOR?

A. No. The Bible says as sinners we all come short of what God wants

us to <u>be</u> and to <u>do</u>.

- 1. Romans 3:23 For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;
  - B. Jesus told Nicodemus in John 3 that we must be "born again".

    1. John 3:1-21
  - C. We must receive a <u>new nature</u>. This is done by repenting of our sins and receiving Jesus as our personal Lord and Saviour.

- 1. Ephesians 4:23-32 (also read Ephesians chapter 5)
  - a. Be renewed in the spirit of your mind.
  - b. Put on the new man.
  - c. Put away lying, speak the truth.
  - d. Don't let the sun go down on your wrath.
  - e. Give no place to the devil.
  - f. Steal not, but labor to have good things to give.
  - g. <u>Speak</u> no corrupt communications but that which ministers <u>grace</u> to the hearers.
  - h. Grieve not the Holy Spirit.
  - i. Put away from you <u>all</u> bitterness, wrath, anger, clamour, evil speaking with malice.
  - j. Be kind one to another.
  - k. Forgive one another.
- D. We may make all kinds of resolutions, repeatedly try to turn over a "new leaf", or say to ourselves "I'll do better tomorrow"; but unless

we have a new nature, we will <u>continually</u> meet failure.

# III. AFTER WE RECEIVE OUR NEW NATURE, HOW DO WE LEARN PROPER CONDUCT?

We learn proper conduct by:

- A. Study of God's Word.
- 1. Psa. 19:8b ...the commandment of the Lord is pure, enlightening

the eyes.

- 2. Psa 119:105 Thy Word is a <u>lamp</u> unto my feet, and a <u>light</u> unto my path.
- 3. Prov. 6:20-23
- 4. Josh 1:8
- 5. II Tim. 3:16 All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and

profitable for doctrine, for <u>reproof</u>, for <u>correction</u>, for <u>instruction</u> in righteousness:

- B. Following the leadership of the Holy Spirit.
  - 1. John 14:26 ... He shall teach you all things,...
  - 2. John 16:13 ...He will guide you into all truth:...
- C. Giving attention to the <u>teachings</u> of God's <u>ministers</u> and <u>teachers</u>.
  - 1. Heb. 13:7
  - 2. Heb. 13:17 Obey them that have the rule over you, and submit yourselves: for they watch for your souls,...
  - 3. Eph. 4:11-13
  - 4. I Peter 5:5a (AMP) Likewise, you who are younger and of

lesser

rank, be <u>subject</u> to the elders (the <u>ministers</u> and spiritual guides of the church) - [giving them due respect and <u>yielding</u> to their counsel]....

#### IV. WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF PROPER CONDUCT?

A. To be <u>sensitive</u> to the Holy Spirt, not <u>hard-hearted</u>. (Mark 3:1-6)

NOTE: The phrase "<u>hardness</u> of heart" in verse 5 means (callousness, dulled perception, lose the power of understanding, hard-hearted).

1. When a person becomes <u>insensitive</u> to the Spirit of God in a service (that includes any part of the service -- singing,

worship,

rebellious, etc.

preaching, etc.), that person will become selfish,

2. When a congregation is <u>insensitive</u> to the Holy Spirit, then

the

Holy Spirit will <u>lift</u> the anointing. Without the anointing, the service is in <u>vain</u>.

- 3. On the contrary, if we are <u>sensitive</u> to the Holy Spirit, we make

  Him welcome, then the anointing <u>flows</u>. This is when lives are changed for the glory of God.
- 4. We show our sensitiveness to Him by our <u>actions</u> in the service.
- 5. Jesus was <u>grieved</u> by their actions. Their actions showed their <u>attitude</u> toward His <u>presence</u>.
  - B. To walk in the <u>Spirit</u>, not in the <u>flesh</u>. (Romans 8:4-8)
    - 1. So that righteousness of the law may be fulfilled in us, we must not <u>walk</u> after the flesh, but after the Spirit.
    - 2. Carnal minded (minding of the <u>flesh</u> -- which is sense and reason <u>without</u> the Holy Spirit)) is <u>death</u>, but spiritually minded (minding of the Spirit) is <u>life</u> and <u>peace</u>.
    - 3. The carnal mind is enmity (hostile and unsubmissive) to God.
    - 4. They that walk in the flesh <u>cannot please</u> God.
  - C. To manifest the <u>fruit</u> of the <u>Spirit</u>, not the works of the flesh. Galatians 5:16-26
    - 1. If you walk, live, and are <u>controlled</u> by the Holy Spirit, then you will not fulfill the <u>lust</u> (gratify the cravings and desires) of the flesh.

2. Because the <u>desires</u> of the flesh and the desires of the Spirit oppose and are <u>contrary</u> to one another, this conflict prevents

us from <u>doing</u> what needs to be done.

3. Works of the flesh (such as: adultery, impurity, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, strife, anger, envy, jealousy, drunkenness) will stop the flow of the anointing.

4. Walking in the Spirit will produce the fruit of the Spirit (love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control) and cause it to be manifested in the church body.

- D. So the <u>Gifts</u> of the <u>Spirit</u> will be manifested by flowing in the anointing, and they will operate in the <u>proper</u> order.
   (I Cor. 14)
- Proper <u>order</u> of the manifestations of the Gifts of the Spirit will

   <u>eliminate</u> confusion and disorder, allowing the peace and order of God to do His work in the church.
  - 2. All things should be done <u>decently</u> and in <u>order</u> in the church.

IT IS THE <u>ANOINTING</u> THAT DESTROYS THE YOKE. YOU CAN SAY ALL THE RIGHT THINGS, BEHAVE <u>PROPERLY</u>, ETC., BUT IT NEEDS TO COME FROM THE HEART. IT MUST HAVE THE ANOINTING TO BE <u>EFFECTIVE</u>.

V. WHAT ARE THE GENERAL RULES OF CONDUCT TO BE OBSERVED IN THE HOUSE OF GOD?

- A. When <u>Late</u> For Services, You Should Be Seated:
  - 1. When the <u>order</u> of service <u>changes</u>.
  - 2. After prayer.
  - 3. After the worship service.
  - 4. Just before the offering.
  - 5. Always when <u>directed</u> to be seated by an usher.
- B. Why Is It Important Not To Create A <u>Disturbance</u> During The Service?
  - 1. You are being <u>discourteous</u> to God Himself by failing to listen to His voice.
  - You are <u>preventing</u> those near you from hearing from God's Word, which can cause someone to <u>miss</u> what God has them (healing, deliverance, etc.), even the call to accept
- their Lord and Saviour.
- C. What Conduct Shows A <u>Disrespect</u> For God's House?
  - 1. Talking during the service:
    - a. Loud conversations or whisperings among yourselves.
    - b. Loud unnecessary <u>comments</u> or <u>inserts</u> to the minister and/or to the Word being ministered (other than appropriate "amens").
    - c. Mocking the minister or the Word that is being
- ministered.

for

Him for

- 2. Writing and passing notes.
- 3. Chewing gum in service.

- 4. Throwing paper on the floor.
- 5. <u>Walking</u> out and back into the sanctuary during the service, except in the most extreme emergency.
- Allowing our children to <u>walk</u> out and back in during the service.
- 7. Not giving our children proper <u>supervision</u> in the sanctuary.
- 8. Allowing our children to <u>mock</u> the minister and/or anyone else in the church.
- 9. <u>Smoking</u> in the building (corridors or restrooms), or in the parking lot.
- 10. Leaving during the Altar Call.

THESE GENERAL RULES OF <u>CONDUCT</u> BEING FOLLOWED WILL INVITE THE HOLY SPIRIT TO <u>FLOW</u> IN THE SERVICE. FOR HE IS A GENTLEMAN AND WILL ONLY MOVE IN OUR MIDST WHEN INVITED.

## VI. CONCLUSION:

- A. Paul the Apostle said in Colossians 3:17, "And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the Name of the Lord Jesus,..."
- B. When we choose Jesus as our Lord and Saviour, we choose His way of <u>doing</u> things.
- C. We want to be <u>obedient</u> to our Lord in everything we do and say, whether at home, on the job, or at church.
- D. All things should be done decently and in order in the church.
